1. Occupational Medicine Physician



Based on the information provided by Ziprecruiter, Glassdoor, and Salarycom, the average salary of an Occupational Medicine Physician is **\$202,929 per year**.

An Occupational Medicine Physician is mainly responsible for:

- Promoting compliance with relevant health and safety laws and regulations
- Helping to develop the necessary policies and procedures that contribute to the social well-being of all employees
- Advise employees regarding health-work-related issues
- Ensure that all employees are informed about health information and steps that should be undertaken to improve their health during work

An Occupational Medicine Physician should be aware of the latest health and safety management standards and apply the knowledge of such standards within the organization.

2. Chief Safety Officer

- Enforcing safety regulations and raising safety awareness

A Chief Safety Officer should be familiar with various types of threats and analyze all situations closely so that the environment where the employees are part of is safe.

3. Occupational Health and Safety Manager

An Occupational Health and Safety Manager is mainly responsible for:

- ✓ Developing safety programs
- Coordinating continual safety trainings and awareness sessions
- ✓ Developing safety objectives
- Regularly inspecting the workplace and safety procedures
- ✓ Promoting a safety culture within the organization

An Occupational Health and Safety Manager should be able to develop all the necessary policies and procedures for ensuring safety within the workplace.

4. Safety Engineer

A Safety Engineer is mainly responsible for:

- Continually searching for ways to prevent workplace accidents
- ✓ Monitoring the work environments
- Inspecting buildings and machines for safety violations
- Evaluating new equipment in order to ensure that the equipment is safe
- Prepare safety campaigns and raise safety awareness through the organization

A Safety Engineer should have strong analytical skills and be detail-oriented since the person appointed such a role should always look for ways to prevent workplace injuries and accidents.

5. Safety Director



Based on the information provided by Payscale, Indeed, and Glassdoor, the average salary of a Safety Director is **\$84,941 per year**.

A Safety Director is mainly responsible for:

- ✓ Developing health and safety procedures
- Managing health and safety policies
- ✓ Performing safety audits
- Preparing safety trainings
- Creating safety initiatives for preventing work accidents

A Safety Director should have an occupational health and safety management certification and have knowledge of the OSHA standards and safety regulations.
